Ian has lead cost analyses to support collective bargaining with teachers unions and to evaluate the costs of service for in-house personnel and contracted vendors.

In addition to his work with school districts, Ian has led or supported multiple revenue enhancement and cost recovery efforts on behalf clients across the nation. He has also worked on reviews of municipal fees for several cities, including the District of Columbia and Manassas, Virginia.

Prior to joining PFM, Ian served as an AmeriCorps VISTA member at a non-profit organization that provided technical assistance and business coaching to low-income entrepreneurs.
